## Russia-Ukraine Conflict: Roots, Dynamics and Prospects

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### **POSSIBLE SCENARIOS**

#### 1. Optimistic scenario (unlikely)

<u>Russia withdraws</u> weapons, military personnel and mercenaries; Ukraine takes control of the border and entire territory; demilitarization, demining, amnesty; return of IDPs, local and national elections; lifting sanctions related to the Minsk agreements against Russia

### 2. Pessimistic scenario (problematic)

- (a) Russia manages to attain its goal of Ukraine's distancing from the West and keeping it in its sphere of influence by non-military means
- **(b)** Russia openly uses its military power to conduct a <u>large scale operation</u> for creating a Russian-controlled arch, connecting Transdnistria and the Crimea with the Russian territory

#### 3. Preservation of the status quo (most likely)

Neither party (Russia or Ukraine) can achieve a clear victory/advantage; sporadic violence; Russia supports "DPR-LPR" at a scale necessary for destabilisation of Ukraine and bargaining with the West; the West maintains sanctions (protracted conflict)

The prospects of a UN peacekeeping operation are very low for the moment, but may occur under each of the scenarios



### PROSPECTS FOR RESOLUTION

- No political solution yet (unconceivable interests of the Parties):
  - Russia isn't ready to retreat (cost-benefit calculations)
  - Ukraine isn't willing to capitulate (Ukrainians want peace, but not at any cost)
- Normandy format Russia as the Party to the conflict takes a seat of a mediator
- Minsk arrangements is the Russian plan to achieve its objectives if implemented in Kremlin's interpretation

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### **RUSSIA-UKRAINE CONFLICT: BASIC FACTS**

- · Illegal annexation of Crimea: Feb 27 Mar 17, 2014
- "Russian Spring" operation: Apr 2014 20??
- 13 thous. killed, incl. 3,340 civilians (298 MH-17 flight); 28 thous. wounded; 1,8 mln. IDPs
- · 43.7 sq.km occupied (7.2% territory of Ukraine)



#### **Enemy Forces (2 Army Corps)**

- ≈ 35,000 troops
- ≈ 475 battle tanks
- ≈ 948 APC, ACV
- ≈208 multiple rocket launchers
- ≈762 artillery systems over 100-mm + anti-aircraft missile systems, MANPADs
- +modern Russian systems of reconnaissance & electronic warfare,, UAVs, Russia-made cluster ammunition, anti-personal

## "UKRAINIAN" CRISIS: DEFINITIONS, OBJECTIVES AND DIMENSIONS OF THE CONFLICT

- Interstate war, act of aggression and a component of new Russian global strategy – neither a civil war, nor a local conflict.
- Russian objectives:
  - Internal (mobilize, distract, oppress...),
  - In Ukraine (destabilize, control, subordinate...),
  - regional (show, integrate, coerce...) and
  - geopolitical (escalate, test, take opportunity...)

Incorrect diagnosis = inappropriate treatment!
